NICARAGUA

On Tuesday 15 August the government of President Daniel Ortega ordered the confiscation of all assets belonging to the prestigious, Jesuit-run, Central American University (UCA) in the capital, Managua, after a judge labelled it a 'center of terrorism organized by criminal groups.' Then, on Wednesday 23 August, the government banned the entire Society of Jesus (Jesuits) from the country and ordered the confiscation of all its assets, claiming the religious order had failed to comply with tax reporting. At the time of writing, only 11 Jesuits remained in the country. The government has been pursuing the Catholic Church since April-May 2018, after it opened its doors to shelter the victims of deadly state violence. Reuters notes (23 Aug) that, since the anti-government protests of 2018, the government has 'outlawed or closed more than 3000 civic groups and nongovernmental organizations'. In its report, The Tablet notes (16 Aug), 'Since 2021 the government has imposed restrictions on 25 private universities, including the Protestant Martin Luther King University.' In May of this year, the government ordered the Nicaraguan Red Cross shut down, accusing it of 'attacks on peace and stability'. In June, the government confiscated properties belonging to 222 forcibly exiled political prisoners, comprising church leaders, rights activists, journalists, and lawyers [see RLPB 681, Forced Exile and Imprisonment, 22 Feb 2023]. The Sixth Commandment: What Does It Mean To Be People Who Preserve Life?

Deuteronomy 19-24

I. Introduction to case law

- II. What does it actually look like to live out the sixth commandment (Dt 5:17)
 - A. Cities of refuge, accidental & premeditated murders (Dt 19:1-13)
 - B. What is the relationship between murder and warfare?1. God is with us (Dt 20:3-4)
 - 2. God wanted 4 types of people excused from military service
 - a. Men who recently built a new house and have not dedicated it to God (20:5)
 - b. Men who recently planted a vineyard and haven't enjoyed its fruit (20:6)
 - c. Men who are engaged but haven't married yet (20:7)
 - d. Men who are fearful and fainthearted (20:8)
 - e. The first three categories seem to have to do with enjoying the gifts of God in life.
 - f. The last one is different; how the battle plan is to proceed (Dt 20:8)
 - (1) First they are to offer terms of peace, and only if these terms are rejected is a battle to ensue. (Dt 20:10-12)
 - (2) Second, they are not to destroy the fruit trees. (Dt 20:20)

- C. Unsolved murders and the sanctity of life. (Dt 21:1-9)
- D. The continuance of food supplies and those who bring forth life (Dt 22:6-7)
- E. Construction case law, safety precautions, and the 6th commandment (Dt 22:8)
- F. Skin diseases (Dt 24:8-9)
 - 1. A refusal to listen to the priest would be tantamount to intentionally murdering another person.
 - 2. The lesson for us today has to do with any disease that is contagious and guarantees death if spread.
- G. The 6th commandment is about so much more than simply not killing people, it is about preserving life in all the various ways that life can be compromised (HC 107)
- III. Jesus and the 6th commandment (Mt 5:21-26, Titus 3:3-8)A. We are all guilty of breaking the sixth commandment.
 - B. Thankfully, Jesus restores life to those who are dead in their sins and trespasses.
