The Resurrection of the Dead and Eternal Judgement

Hebrews 6:2

- I. Foundational Doctrines Review
- II. Resurrection of the Dead
 - A. Without this doctrine Christian hope is gone and we are liars and pitiable (1Cor 15:13-19).
 - 1. Fundamental problem with the world is sin. Sin produced death. Unless death can be defeated there is no proof that sin can be overcome.
 - 2. A central component of the apostolic message (Act 4:2, 4:33, 17:18, 17:32, 1Pet 1:3).
 - B. Every person who has ever physically died will be resurrected (Dan 12:2, Jn 5:28-29, Act 24:15, Jn 11:24-25)
 - C. Involves a separation of people (Mt 25:31, 33).
 - D. The Christian's hope is that through death we enter into eternal life with God, and will ultimately receive a physical body and live in a physically recreated world where life flourishes and God is worshiped fully and without restraint or hindrance. (Rev 20:5-6)

- E. Distortions of Resurrection
- III. Eternal Judgment
 - A. What will people be judged for? (Rev 20:12, 21:8,1Cor 6:9-11, Titus 3:2-6)
 - B. The greater sin: Blasphemy of the Spirit (Mt12:31)
 - C. This judgment is described in terrifying images in the Bible
 - 1. Fire that never ceases (Prov 30:16)
 - 2. Weeping and gnashing of teeth (Mt 13:42)
 - 3. Consciousness torment (Lk 16:19ff)
 - D. Distortions of Eternal Judgment
 (Dan. 12:2; Matt. 25:41, 46; Mark 9:43–48; 2 Thess. 1:9–10)
- IV. Closing Thoughts
 - A. These doctrines
 - 1. Serve to help us in the times of trial and temptation.
 - 2. Aid us in evangelism.
